



Curriculum News



Step 3: Tightening Tension

Every great story needs a gripping tension scene! You must believe the hero (male or female) will fail. The tornado is too strong, the villain is too evil, the black forces of depression are too overwhelming. Yet, through strength, talent and determination, somehow our hero wins.

Many students make their tension scenes too short and never build much tension at all. Step 3 focuses on building tension scenes slowly and using sensory details to put the reader in the heart of the story – as if they were really there.



This term, **3 Red** have been learning how to use their 5 senses (sight, smell, touch, taste and sound) along with their feelings, to create tightening tension and description in a story. They were shown the image below, brainstormed using all their senses, then turned it into a tension scene for a story. Here are just a few of our amazing ideas...






