Please also read below to see some reflections from each of our teachers.

It has been so wonderful to see our students returning to face to face teaching in their classes 2 days this week. Teachers and students are very happy to be returning to some normality and we cannot wait until we are all back to full time schooling. But for next week our transition phase remains as is:

K-2 attend Monday & Tuesday
3-6 attend Wednesday & Thursday
Children of essential workers or no other care options attend Friday

We acknowledge that some students may be feeling anxious about returning to classes and friends and this is quite normal. Please see the letter from our school psychologist, Gayna Turner, posted on Compass this week. It has many helpful tips for supporting your children during this time of transition.

Gayna and our Pastoral Care Worker, Maree, are both available as the term progresses if you need further support.

**EXTRA CLEANING** – We have received some financial support from the Catholic Schools Office to support the additional cleaning services being delivered at St Joseph's. We are thankful to Mrs Yi who has taken up the role of daily cleaning, 11am-1pm. This combined with our regular daily, after hours service by our contract cleaners is ensuring that a high standard of hygiene is in place at our school.

Please care for your children at home if they are unwell and if they show any signs of illness such as: persistent cough, sneezing, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhoea, conjunctivitis. Children should be free of fevers, vomiting and diarrhoea for 24 hours before returning to school. Colds and flus will increase as the cooler weather sets in, so we ask all parents to work with the school to ensure we limit the spread of all illness. We appreciate your support!

**EASTER RAFFLE** – Thank you to those who donated eggs to our Easter raffle last term and to those who bought tickets before the COVID school closure. We also received a large amount of donations from our local Meals on Wheels service which was greatly appreciated. The raffle was drawn, and all prizes have been sent home this week. Congratulations to our lucky winners! The money raised will go to our P & F funds which help support the purchase of school resources.



#### PICK UP AND DROP OFF ARRANGEMENTS - CAMROSE ST. & SHELTON ST.


#### **HOME LEARNING REFLECTIONS**


#### Kinder Mrs Foxon, Ms Nolan & Mrs Schumacher






















#### Year 1 Mrs Woodward, Mrs Bourke & Mrs Macourt


Year 1 students have been engaging in Home Learning tasks and we have loved seeing them in action to produce some amazing number lines that are longer than the children themselves.










#### YEAR 2 B Mrs Clare Paff and Ms Megan Jones







#### Year 3/4B Mrs Davis & Mrs McGlynn


It has been lovely to see the children's confidence grow as they learn this new skill.




