

Dear Parents and Carers,
As you are aware our system is continuing a staggered approach to the return to fulltime face to face teaching with a gradual increase of students on site next week and full return for all in Week 6. Our plans for St Joseph's are as follows:



WEEK 5 Monday 25th May - Friday 29th May

K-2 attend Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday 3-6 attend Wednesday, Thursday and Friday

WEEK 6 Monday 1st - Friday 5th June

All students return to full time attendance

Children of essential workers or no other care options attend as needed

Please be assured that we will continue to have extra daily cleaning services in place, maintain our strict hygiene practices, no extra adults on site, and no whole school gatherings or assemblies until further notice.

Teachers will send reduced Home Leaning activities for next week via Compass and Zoom meetings will no longer be scheduled. At school, the teaching of English, Maths and Religion will be a priority in the classroom. Teachers will be working with their students to assess their needs and program accordingly. Semester 1 reports will look very different to the usual report and will be delivered early Term 3. More reporting information will follow in the coming weeks.

Please care for your children at home if they are unwell and if they show any signs of illness such as: persistent cough, sneezing, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhoea, conjunctivitis. Children should be free of fevers, vomiting and diarrhoea for 24 hours before returning to school. Colds and flus will increase as the cooler weather sets in, so we ask all parents to work with the school to ensure we limit the spread of all illness. We appreciate your support!

ICAS Tests

Each year we offer our students the opportunity to participate in the world-renowned ICAS Assessments. ICAS is developed by UNSW Global, a wholly owned subsidiary of UNSW Sydney, with over 35 years' experience in educational assessments.

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Digital Technologies. They are **challenging tests** that test skills and content beyond the standard curriculum, and are suitable for students wishing to **extend themselves academically** and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment

ICAS Assessments are now online, and this year students can participate in the following subjects:

ICAS Science Yr 3 to 6
ICAS Digital Technologies Yr 3 to 6
ICAS English Yr 2 to 6
ICAS Maths Yr 2 to 6
ICAS Spelling Yr 2 to 6



The cost per test: \$15.95 including GST and the tests will be held at school during August.



Just Dance


You should play just dance with me because...




