

We are looking forward to a fun day and will be sure to post lots of great photos to share with our families.


National Child Protection Week




RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

BOLT FOR GOLD!


A local cause close to SJC's heart is holding a fundraiser on Saturday, September 26, which is **DIPG awareness day.**

NEWS FROM THE PRIMARY COORDINATOR



Our Staff participated in a fantastic Professional Development Day last week on VCOP. We would like to introduce the VCOP Gang to our St Joey's Community.

Vinny Vocabulary - Yellow

Vinny is the leader of the VCOP Gang, because 'WOW words' are really empowering to a piece of writing. He is a Knight in shining armour that will rescue your writing. That's why he holds the 'Big Write' pencil. When you and the gang use the special 'Big Write' pencil, you can write an adventure that will truly come alive for the reader. Vinny also wears a purple shirt, because generalising words (usually, sometimes, etc.) are purple. Generalising words are really difficult to remember but can create a lot of impact for your writing just like the 'WOW words', so his shirt is a reminder to use them.

Connie Connective - Pink

Connie is an Aviator Mechanic and enjoys travelling between places. She has pockets full of tools, like wrenches, spanners and screwdrivers. This is because she likes joining and connecting things together using things like screws, nuts and bolts, just like how a connective can join sentences together. But we need to be careful, like a Mechanic, and choose the right connective in order for the sentence to make sense and work. Also, we can't use too many nuts and bolts (connectives) in the one sentence or it could become weak and break.

Ollie Opener - Blue

Ollie is one very cool Viking that doesn't let anyone stand in his way. He protects the start of sentences, but his openers can become predictable and boring if he repeats himself too often. So Ollie has to make sure that he starts his sentences in many different ways. The more powerful his opener is, the more he can set the scene. Ollie knows that he is not alone either. He knows that if he uses a 'Power Opener', (one of Connie's connectives, a 'ly' word or an 'ing' word) at the beginning, then his sentence will become even more powerful.

Penny Punctuation - Green

Penny is a Princess standing at the top of the pyramid letting her hair flow down. She finds it very easy at the top of the pyramid, but often needs help from the rest of the gang to get down. The others realise just how important Penny is to their story, so they read aloud to her. They know that the more they include her, the further down the pyramid she can come. But Penny has to listen very carefully to hear exactly how the gang wants their story to sound, and gives them the right punctuation to make this happen. Penny and Ollie often work closely together. Like Ollie, Penny knows she can add extra excitement to the story by using her 'Power Punctuation' of question marks and exclamation marks.

WORD OF THE WEEK

So what's all the hype about <u>Word of the Week</u>? It comes down to the simplicity of the idea and more importantly the huge impact it can make in expanding vocabulary, as well as improving reading and writing.

Week 8: Word of the Week for K-2

Shriek

Definition: a sharp and shrill sound Example: My brother will shriek if you give him a fright. Activity: What situations might cause someone to shriek?

Week 9: Word of the Week for K-2

hoarse

Definition: rough in sound

Example: My sister screamed so loudly her voice became hoarse.

Activity: What sounds can you think of that would be considered hoarse?

Week 8: Word of the Week for 3-6

bewildered

Definition: perplexed and confused; very puzzled Similar words: baffled, confused, mystified

Example: I was bewildered by the strange noises coming from outside my window.

Activity: What is something that bewilders you? Write a short riddle that is designed to bewilder someone.

Week 9: Word of the Week for 3-6

tentative

Definition: done without confidence; uncertain Similar words: unsure, unsettled, hesitant

Example: Mia was tentative as she approached the stage to perform her solo.

Activity: What might a tentative person look like? How might they be feeling? Discuss a time you were feeling tentative.


