

Some staffing arrangements have been finalised for 2021 with the continuing of full-time contracts for another 12 months of Miss Heather Wozniak, Mr Mark Faith and part time contracts for Mrs Jessica Bourke and our Music Specialist teacher, Mrs Karyn Savage. We have employed a new temporary teacher to fill Mrs Angela Shaw's maternity leave- Molly Kalchbauer will be joining us in 2021. We are currently advertising for a Learning Support Teacher to fill Mrs Amber Christie's upcoming maternity leave for next year. Mrs Stephanie Tranter has been appointed the Gifted Education Mentor for 2021 and Mrs Kathryn Hill and Mrs Kyla Flanagan will continue in their roles as Pedagogical Mentors. I congratulate all these staff on their appointments.

We have 40 enrolments confirmed for Kinder 2021 and we are very much looking forward to welcoming them to SJC for visits over the next 2 Fridays. With some easing of restrictions, we can have the children onsite but still need to maintain social distancing of adults. Our planned end of year activities and celebrations are being revised with the new regulations in mind. We will send out further information next week.

Our drop off and pick up arrangements on Shelton St and Camrose St will also need to be maintained until the end of the year. Over the last few months I have been in consultation with the Lake Macquarie Council Traffic Management team to

improve our procedures. This involves consultation with LM council, NSW Transport, NSW Police, neighbouring property owners and our school bus company. As you can appreciate this is a lengthy process. The consultant was here last week observing the road and pedestrian traffic and is devising a more suitable plan for 2021. We thank you for your cooperation and continue to encourage you to keep to the road, parking and signage rules in our school zones.

Please remember our upcoming **PUPIL FREE DAY** this **MONDAY 16th November**. This is a staff Faith Formation day and was postponed from Term 1 due to COVID-19. This day helps teachers and staff attain important faith accreditation as part of their responsibilities of working in a Catholic school. 



Word ending in -ly: Cheerfully, my friends and I devoured our cake and ice cream. (In this example, the opener is 'Cheerfully.')

will remain at school. More information will follow as the term progresses.


