We prayed together for a year filled with enriching learning, care for each other and for our environment. Fr. John spoke to the students about the importance of respect for each other, for parents and for teachers. He reminded us all to keep Jesus close to our hearts, to pray for our needs and the needs of others. It has been a great start to 2021 and we all look forward to the wonderful year ahead.

Last week we welcomed our beautiful Kinder students to SJC. They have settled in amazingly and are so clever at following the routines of the classroom and the playground. It has been delightful watching them arrive each day and I've been so proud of the many students who are entering the school gates with their siblings or even on their own with a happy smile. Parents of Kinder, Year 1 and Year 2 may still walk into the school for drop off and pick up being mindful of social distancing protocols. Thank you to all parents for continuing to follow our pickup and drop off arrangements. If your children are not picked up in the afternoons by the last bus around 3:20pm they will need to wait at the school office for parents. Any later than this please access our St Nic's OOSH services.



This week we also welcomed a new enrolment to Year 5/6 Red. Francesco and his family have recently moved from Melbourne. We hope that they feel welcomed into our community and meet many new friends. Our school's population is growing with a pleasing 250 students enrolled this year. We will open Kinder enrolments for 2022 next

month. Please pass on our details to family and friends for those seeking to enrol at St Joseph's.

This year we have become involved in the Diocesan *Successful Foundations Research Project*. This project supports the positive transition to school of 2021 Kindergarten children and supports system wide implementation of the Early Learning Policy for Catholic schools in the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle. Tomorrow Kim Moroney, Project author and leader will be visiting our Kinder classroom to work with Kinder teachers and students to enhance the rollout of the project.

2021 also sees St Joseph's become a **Gifted Education Lead School (GEL)**, with the appointment of a Gifted Education Mentor (GEM) in Stephanie Tranter and connections to the Lakes Region Gifted schools and St Mary's High School. We are excited to be a part of this Diocesan initiative and are eager to improve differentiation practices, assessment, and identification strategies to enhance learning for our gifted students. Last Monday night our teachers participated in the first of our professional learning opportunities in this area. In the coming weeks, all students in Year 1-6 will participate in assessment tasks to help identification of strengths and weaknesses for all learners with highlighting of gifted students. These assessments will assist our teachers and GEM to plan for and cater for these students learning needs.

There have been many **improvements and maintenance** projects at SJC over the holidays including the installation of flyscreens and air conditioning to the OOSH and canteen areas, cleaning and maintenance to all air conditioners across the school, plumbing works, annual external and internal pest treatments, carpet and window cleaning and tree maintenance and major gardening and landscaping work. The most exciting project is the major refurbishment to our old Multi-Purpose Room. This room has been totally renovated and will become the new classroom for Year 2. New furniture has also been purchased for this space. Official handover will take place next week and then Year 2 will move into this wonderful new learning space. We will post photos next week!

Many new resources include the purchase and installation of 3 interactive screens for Year 5/6 and Year 2, new sport equipment, sandpit toys and a new water bottle filling and drinking station to be installed in the coming weeks. We are also very grateful to the SJC Parents and Friends Association who have funded the purchase and upgrade of 30 new laptops to the value of \$23 000 for our Learning Hub. See the poster at the end of the newsletter. This funding comes from the efforts of P&F fundraisers, canteen and uniform shop profits and are only possible with the support of our families and the wonderful volunteers we have across our community. Our next P&F meeting is on Monday 15th Feb. in the staffroom, 6:30pm. Please join us if you would like to assist in some way throughout the year.

The Office of Safeguarding has been set up by the Bishop, with the Catholic Schools Office (CSO), to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all our students, staff and parents. Our latest version of the Volunteer Handbook (Version 1.5) is now available and has some changes to volunteering procedures at school. All volunteers are required to have a National Police Check (NPC) registered and full clearance to be approved by the Catholic Schools Office. Each volunteer is required to complete a Statutory Screening Selection Tool which



determines if a Working with Children's Check is required (now only required for overnight camps if you are a close relative).

The instructions regarding identification and obtaining the NPC have also changed and this is also included in the handbook. The handbook is available from the school office. Any volunteer that has already completed the NPC last year are still cleared to volunteer, however everyone else will need to resubmit their handbook and receive clearance.

We appreciate that there have been many changes over the last few years regarding this process and we thank you for taking the time to read this and to complete the process for volunteering.

We truly appreciate our St. Joey's volunteers!

School Fees will be issued in the coming weeks with changes to the billing procedures. Parents will have more flexibility to set the weekly, fortnightly or monthly payments via Bpay, Direct Debit, Credit Card etc. The Catholic Schools Office will be sending updated information to all families next week.



News from the Primary Coordinator

PBL (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING) AT ST JOSEPH'S

In 2021 our school will continue to implement our PBL policy which is underpinned by our SJC values. Over the coming weeks our newsletter will explain how PBL works at St Joseph's, and how we encourage all our children to...



BOUNCE BACK

This year our school will also continue to implement the Bounce Back program to instil resilience. Resilience is the capacity to cope well in times of adversity or hardship. Resilience is the ability to bounce back from difficult times while retaining a positive sense of self. The newsletter will also continue to focus on this each fortnight.





<u>VCOP & Big Write:</u> Last year St Joseph's began implementing VCOP and Big Writes across the classrooms. Each newsletter, we will add information to help you discuss VCOP and Big Writes in your home.

What is VCOP and Big Write?

VCOP and Big Write is a teaching approach based on the research of Ros Wilson, an expert based in the UK. It focuses on four main aspects of the writing process (VCOP) and provides children with the skills to improve their own writing through self-assessment. We have four mascots that represent each section of VCOP.

V is for Vocabulary:

Vinnie Vocabulary is our vocabulary mascot. He assists students in the use of 'WOW words' in their writing. Wow words are words that are also known as ambitious vocabulary, this is based on the students' age and ability.

C is for Connectives:

Connie Connectives is our connectives mascot. She supports students in using connectives (joining words) to change their simple sentences into complex sentence.

O is for Openers:

Ollie Opener is our openers mascot. Ollie encourages students to use varied openers to ensure their writing doesn't appear 'boring'.

P is for Punctuation:

Penny Punctuation is our punctuation mascot. Children are taught the names of the different types of punctuation and they learn to use them in their writing.



BIG WRITE:

Big Write is a celebration of students' learning. The biggest difference between Big Write and the 'everyday' writing session is the environment. The classroom has a different atmosphere. The lights are tuned off or down, candles are used, and quiet music is playing. Students are not allowed to talk to each other, and the teacher takes this time to


conference with students one to one and look at their individual writing goals.

Why is talking so important?

Talk becomes critical when students discuss tasks or ideas and question one another, negotiate meaning, clarify their own understanding, and make their ideas comprehensible to their partners. It is during collaborative tasks that students must use academic language if they are to focus on the content.

St Joseph's is the place to be!:

A former student has made a special book about how wonderful St Joseph's is to be a student. Audrey graduated from Year 6 in 2018 and this year her sister Ashlyn has started Kindergarten here at Joey's. Audrey kindly made her sister a detailed hand-made book with all the information Ashlyn will need to know about St Joseph's. Apart from the exceptional drawings and images, this book was filled with excellent examples of high-level vocabulary and emotive text. This is just another example of the amazing writing that flows from our St Joseph's students (both current and from our graduates). What a special keepsake!
