
A focus on Learning, Collaboration & Improving Student Outcomes

Dear Parents.

After recent *Big Writes* teachers will be working with students to set new Writing learning goals. St Joseph's teachers are very committed to building the capacity of our students to have the skills to equip them for their future. Most of our students are adaptable, innovative and socially engaged. However, there can be gaps. Current research suggests that one such gap is "self-direction" (Teaching for Tomorrow- McQueen 2019). All students will have the opportunity to identify their strengths and areas for improvement in 'Writing' with their teacher during these student-teacher conferences. It is our hope that this encourages students to set new personalised learning goals and have a clear understanding of their criteria for success.

I encourage you to engage in a conversation with your child about their learning goal. Give emphasis on the process and discuss their self-monitoring/evaluation rather than just the end result.


NEWS FROM THE PRIMARY COORDINATOR


Peer and self-assessment is an essential aspect of 'assessment as learning' (formative assessment):

- -G-R-O-W
- Peer assessment involves students reflecting on the work of their peers, against success criteria related to a learning goal, and providing constructive feedback.
- Self-assessment involves students applying success criteria related to a learning goal, reflecting on their efforts, identifying improvements and adjusting the 'quality' of their work.

Meaningful peer and student self-assessment have the potential to positively contribute to student learning and achievement. At St Joseph's, we use two stars and a wish to provide effective feedback.









Conversations with your children:

How many times have your afternoon conversations with your child sounded like this: "How was your day?" "Fine." "What did you learn today?" "Nothing." Yes, these types of conversations happened in my home, too. How do we get our kids to open up and share about their day? Because, what we really want is a deep connection with our children (this helps a LOT when they're older). And, it doesn't happen if we don't get to know their world. One-word answers don't help us reconnect with our kids after a long day apart from each other. That's why we need questioning strategies that will enable more than one word responses. Here's a great list to help you:



Word of the week in weeks 9-10 for K-2: Mystify: to confuse someone completely. Word of the week in weeks 9-10 for 3-6: Eloquent: expressive

PDHPE PROGRAM - TERM 3 2021

Next term as part of our *Personal Development, Health & Physical Education* (PDHPE) Key Learning Area we have once again engaged the professional dance company – Dance Fever. Dance is a key component of our PDHPE Primary curriculum, being one of the 8 strands to be covered in our current syllabus. These strands include, Active Lifestyle, Games and Sports, Gymnastics, **Dance**, Growth and Development, Interpersonal Relationships, Personal Health Choices and Safe Living.

Dance Fever provide experienced dance professionals to teach over 9 weeks of the term. The students will be engaged in a variety of lessons including Hip Hop, Fox Trot, Cha Cha, Contemporary, Cultural and Creative compositions. 


