Dear Parents and Carers,
It is good to back at school for another term of learning,
friendship, faith and fun. Despite the concerns with COVID
and restrictions back in place for now, the children have settled in
well. Thank you for your support of the guidelines sent via COMPASS and adhering
to the restrictions in place. We want to continue to keep our school community
safe and our school open!

During our Pupil Free day on Monday the staff participated in faith formation via Zoom with Professor Michael Dennin, a US based scientist and astronomer. The day was based on his writings in *'Divine Science Finding Reason at the Heart of Faith'*. Some of the topics covered were Faith and Science, Images of God, the Fullness of Reality and Miracles. It was certainly an interesting and challenging day which gave staff an opportunity to develop their understandings and deepen their faith. Faith formation is an important part of our development as teachers in a Catholic school and as people of God.



This week we welcomed the Biddleston and Mitchell families to St Joseph's. Ivy, Keesha and Lily joined 5/6R and Summer joined 3R. It is lovely to see these students settle so beautifully into our classes and I am sure you will welcome their families into our SJC community.

We also welcome two University placements this term, Michelle Turner in 4R and Taylor Sansom 3R. Both teachers will be working alongside their supervising teachers for a period of 4 weeks. This is an important and valuable experience for our developing teachers and helps to grow our teaching profession.

Next week we welcome Mrs Cathy Curk as our new Gifted Education Mentor (GEM). Cathy is an experienced GEM and works at St Patrick's Swansea in this role as well. She will be working collaboratively with our staff and students each Monday to develop differentiated lessons, programs and individual support for our gifted students. I take this opportunity to thank Mrs Stephanie Tranter who was in this role for Term 1 & 2 and will be handing over to Cathy next week.

In other staffing news we farewell Mrs Jessica Bourke who has decided to take some time to finish her university studies in Inclusive Education. Mrs Bourke has

been a valued member of staff since 2019 and will be missed. We are currently in the recruitment phase of employing a new teacher for the part time positions in Stage 2. There is a grave teacher shortage at present in our Diocese which is also impacting casual teaching availability.

Winter Uniform – every student should now be wearing full winter uniform including correct footwear.

It is wonderful to see the students who take pride in our school uniform. There are many benefits to wearing a uniform as it creates a sense of belonging and togetherness. It can instil a sense of pride and creates a level playing field for all. The worries of looking different or of pressure to wear the latest craze is taken away so students can feel equal with their peers and are more likely to concentrate on their learning than worrying about what they are wearing. We ask support of all parents to support our uniform code as this is part of your agreement upon enrolment. Students continually wearing the incorrect items will receive warnings and consequences as per our PBL policy.


Rebel Community Give-back Credits



NEWS FROM THE PRIMARY COORDINATOR

Teaching self-regulation:

Building your child's skills in self-regulation helps your child for life. Empower your child in this learning by supporting them to make their own choices. Try giving them options and help them choose the most sensible one by verbalising your own thought process.



- "Shall we have a drink first, or wash our hands first?"
- "Shall we play on the iPad for 5 more minutes, or shall we go outside now? I think outside would make me feel happy and healthy! What do you think?"

Giving specific choices helps also to set limits – regardless of the child's answer; they are hearing that they will go outside soon – helping them set their own expectations of what is reasonable and sensible. When it's time to leave or finish an activity, help your child 'get ready' for the change. Give them notice, e.g. "We need to get out of the pool soon."

Self-regulation is a skill that needs to be supported in children because it is key to their overall success and happiness. Children who can cope with stress, anger, disappointment, and frustration are more able to do well in school, with friends, and at home. Remember that the more children practice regulating themselves, the easier it will become for them to cope with and adapt to change. You can help children by removing unnecessary demands and guiding them with loving support.





Aboriginal Education News

What a wonderful Term 2 we had in Aboriginal Education at St Joseph's! A highlight was certainly the visit from Aunty Chris and sharing her amazing life story with our Stage 3 students.

Many classes also had lots of fun participating in cultural activities. It was wonderful learning about the Jalala Dreaming story and making Jalala Stone Dreaming Art – inspired by artist, Jack Dale Mengenen from the Kimberly region of Australia.

We also enjoyed learning about the use of message sticks as a form of communication in traditional Aboriginal life. Did you know that if you were in possession of a message stick, you were respectfully escorted across 'Country' of other Aboriginal nations until you reached your destination? Prior to white arrival, Australia was occupied by around 250 different Aboriginal nations, each with their own Country which they were connected to. So, if you needed to cross Wonnaura Country – you would wait on the boundary and send a smoke signal to alert the men that you were there and needed to cross that Country. Your message stick would then be presented as a type of 'passport'. The Wonnaura men would then escort you across Wonnaura Country until you reached the border of the next Country you needed to cross. Interesting!!

We've also enjoyed time outside learning about traditional Dreaming stories with Kindergarten. A great way to connect with these stories is to be amongst our beautiful surrounding bushland at St Joseph's. Kindergarten students love role playing Dreaming stories and everyday practices common in daily life of a traditional Aboriginal person. This term is certainly looking action packed for Aboriginal Education at St Joseph's Charlestown!

Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions our planned NAIDOC celebrations have been postponed till later in the term. But we will still participate in a variety of learning experiences across the school to mark this important occasion. We will look forward to welcoming Stephanie Callaghan later in the term to host this day for us. She will also be accompanied by experienced dance consultant – Mauri Perry. I'm sure students will thoroughly enjoy participating in meaningful and fun activities throughout the day.

Watch this space for more exciting cultural opportunities for our school.
