Next week school remains open for children of essential workers. We understand that with retail opening and other services, more parents may need to send their children to school. However, we are still expected to have minimum staff on site to reduce any chance of COVID transmission while still under the current restrictions. Please use our Compass Events Opt In facility so as to ensure we have enough staff to cover the number of children on site. Unfortunately, this week we have had up to 30 unexpected students, on some days resulting in staff having to be called in to assist with supervision. Some parents had glitches with the Compass system and we are seeking IT support with this, and have appreciated the email notification of their child's attendance. The glitch seems to happen when using the Compass App on your phone so please use a laptop or PC to OPT in.

MATTHEW 3/4 Blue




WELCOME BACK TO TERM 4

Teachers are very much looking forward to the gradual return of students in the coming weeks.

Most children will be very excited to return to school in the next few weeks to see all their friends.

Most children will be very excited to return to school in the next few weeks to see all their friends and teachers. A certain degree of worry and fear about returning to school, especially following this time away from face-to-face

learning, and in the current pandemic, is normal for children and young people. However, most students find that these worrying feelings decrease over time once back at school and following the school routine. Here are some tips to support your child in transitioning back to school.



Tell Them From Me Survey

In 2020 we asked **parents and carers** to participate in a survey conducted by Tell Them From Me© (TTFM). The information gathered from this survey helps our school community to be better informed about what we are doing well, where we need to focus more attention and how we can sharpen our planning to ensure we achieve improved outcomes for our students.

As parents and carers of students in our school, we deeply value your feedback and encourage you to partner with us and complete this survey. The information we gather is important to us and allows us to hear directly from you and gain insight into what you think is important about the work we do, how we communicate with you and where you think we need to improve.

We want all children in our school to thrive and we know that working together, listening, and sharing ideas helps us to improve and grow as strong learning and faith communities.

When the survey opens, you will receive a Compass notification. We appreciate your feedback. If you have questions about this survey, please don't hesitate to email admin@charlestown.catholic.edu.au.

Students from Years 4 to 6 are also invited to participate in the Tell Them From Me online survey again this year. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what these students think about their faith, school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

Students from Years 4 to Year 6 will be given the opportunity and time to participate in this survey. Students will be given a random username and password to access and complete the survey online. Students' names cannot be linked to their responses which allows it to be completely anonymous. Results will show all student scores combined – it is not possible to single out individual students in the results.

The survey takes approximately 15-20 minutes to complete. The survey measures include such topics as emotional and social wellbeing, physical health, and behaviours and attitudes linked to student success.

Participation in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish to. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable answering any question, they should leave it blank and move on to the next one. Your child can stop the survey at any time.

Last term we sent compass/email alerts requesting opt-out advice; if you do not want your child to take part in the survey. If this is the case, please email admin@charlestown.catholic.edu.au with your child/ren's name and class by Friday 15th October.

We have also been working on our sentence writing and making equal groups in maths. We are so proud of kindergarten's efforts this week!







Year 1 Home Learning


